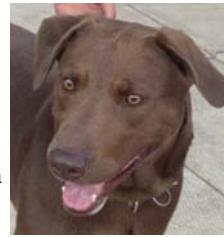

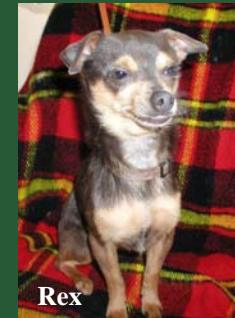

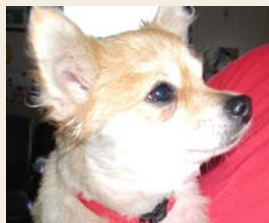
Hello Supporters and Volunteers,
