Public outreach is also on the top of my list & I hope to be in area schools discussing dog bite prevention, spay/neuter & responsible pet guardianship.

I have big shoes to fill, yet I'm up to the task and look forward to working with & hearing from all of our supporters.





The Cost of Adoption

Like any year, 2023 has not been without challenges. People for Pets has had over 200 cats and dogs turn to the shelter at their time of need. Some of the pets have been severely injured, ill, malnourished, abused & neglected. With that being said, our veterinary bills have added up to over \$60,000 this year. Those vet bills helped 153 pets find homes through adoption & allowed another 57 homeless pets to be transferred to both breed rescue & other no-kill shelters to placement in loving homes. Adoption fees only cover a fraction of the cost of getting some of these animals ready for adoption. This is why our nonprofit no-kill shelters relies on your generosity to give these deserving animals a second lease on life.

The Beautiful Story of Hope and Von

On a warm May day, Jenna received a call that there were 2 dogs left in a garage on an acreage. They were left with a small amount of water and a open bag of food dumped on the dirty cement ground. Jenna and Steph went on a mission to save these poor dogs. Both Hope and Von were matted all the way down to the skin. It took nearly 4 hours to get their hair shaved. Upon taking them in to the vet, Hope just needed some simple dental work done, but Von was diagnosed with a stage 5 heart murmur. He was put on lifelong medicine that will help reduce the progression of the murmur. A couple months later, a lump was found on Hopes neck that was surgically removed and send out for testing, which thankfully later came back benign. After spending 4 months at the shelter, they were both adopted together to a family who loves them despite their medical needs.

We brought dogs there, and all the students loved walking them. We made \$775.

Flash, now named Rocky, came into the shelter in 2016 as a local stray. This boy was so sweet but was shy, so was often turned away by people who came in to look at cats. Our friends and great supporters adopted Rocky in February. He is doing great!

The Doggy Dip is hosted by the Spencer YMCA every year on the last day our aquatic center is open. All the money that is made gets donated to us. This event is always a big hit. This year we made \$1,020!



Paris

Paris arrived at the shelter after her breeder was done with her. It was very obvious this girl had been through a lot, and needed quite a bit of medical attention. Our friends at Critter Crusaders were able to help with this situation. They put Paris in a foster home in Des Moines so she could have better access to where she would be getting her medical care. After many procedures, Paris was doing great, so she was transferred to SNAFU rescue. She has since been adopted.




A Sweet Message from the Adopters of Rebel
